NEW BUSINESS

It was moved that Ron Mihills be nominated for Mr. Campus. This motion was tabled until next week so that it can be referred to committee and a report given to Council.

Dr. Ellingston suggested some constitutional changes which are being considered. The following constitutional amendments were read and will be discussed in two weeks:

Article IV Section 2 "Newsletters" Student Senate By-Laws

Part A. Delete.

Substitute: "A Departmental Senator shall be responsible for the distribution of the Student Senate Newsletter which will be published under the direction of the Public Relations Committee. It is to be distributed no later than the end of the school day after receipt of said newsletters by the Senators."

Part B. Delete the word "production and substitute the word "distribution."

Part C. Delete the words "published" (twice on the first line) and substitute the word "distribution" for each.

Delete the word "production" (line three) and substitute the word "distribution."

"Organizational Senators" paragraph: Delete all but the last line.

Substitute "Organizational Senators shall be responsible for distribution of the Student Senate Newsletter to the executives of their respective organizations. Distribution will take place at the next scheduled meeting of that organization following the receipt of the newsletter by the Senators."

Amendments to the Student Senate By-Laws

Article II Section 1 Part B, 3 (Page 9)

Add: f. Serve as chairman of the Secretariat.

Article V Section 8:

A. Add: 4. To write the Student Senate Newsletter for publication under the direction of the Public Relations Committee.

Student Activities Board (By-Laws)

Article V Section 2 Part E Public Relations

2. Add:, including printing of the Student Senate Newsletters written by the Secretariat.

Gordon West was reinstated as a Senator.
