

The meeting was called to order by Vice President

Tom Staab at 7:10 pm. Following the opening prayer, the roll was called, minutes read and approved.

Joe Ford and William Rose gave a program on the College Union giving the philosophy and purpose of it. They then answered questions on the subject.

Rev. Gorden gave a talk on the Hungarian Revolution asking to consider a petition seeking to urge the United Nations to condemn the atrocities that took place 10 years ago. Judy Fisher made motion to send petition endorsed by Senate, but was not seconded.

Chairman's report: Comment was made on the form resolutions should be handed in. Letter from Decan Jani was read about Alcohol on the New Camous. Four resignations were turned in and read: Andrew Phillips, Jean Guy Naud, Bob Bristol, and Kathy Foltyn. Comment was made on the responsibilities Senators have. Dave Folkman was installed as IFC Senator.

SAB: Resolution #11 was passed that a commission be formed deliniating responsibilities and suggesting changes that must take place in the restructuring of the student association constitution as related to organization they will represent. It was amended to include 1 member from IFC and 1 from Panhellenic. Ray Baker reported on Project Communications and its purpose. The Student Partisan was brought up and whether it goes against the Student Senate Constitution. Found it doesn't.

Policy Committee: Formation of an organization of people in housing and formulate new policies to bring before Senate.


Old Business: None
