

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Tom Staab at 7:08pm. Following the opening prayer, the roll was called, minutes read and approved.

Order of the agenda was announced.

Constitution Committee: The Parliamentarian presented a proposal for the Communications Board which will be tabled until next week. It was stated that a lot of trouble was involved in setting this up and action is needed right away. Questioned were asked and opinions are wanted. This was passed by the Administration.

Chairman's Report: Dave Folkman is back as the Senator from IFC. Chairman Staab stated that he hopes this will be one of the best quarters in Senates history. Most important issues will hit the floor of Senate since it started. Senate grades will be ready at the next meeting.

SAB: Mr. Proud presented the Student Association Budget. Next week it will be formally introduced and action will be taken on it in the following weeks. Resolution #47 was presented concerning money for Student Council Newsletter. It was seconded and passed. Next week the Constitution for the President's Cabinet will be introduced for Senates Consideration. The Long Range Planning Conference will be held April 14&15 and more student participation is planned. Mr. Baker made a change in Resolution #46 adding with the approval of Spring Weekend Chairman, instead of vetoing it. This was then presented as an amendment by Senate. It was discussed and defeated. It was then presented as the original Resolution to reconsider. It was seconded and passed to reconsider. There was discussion on the Resolution and defeated.

Departmental Reports: Foods will present theirs next week.

Secretariat: Reports for next week are Foods, Chemistry, Retailing, and Photo.

Acc. Affairs: Last meeting was March 7. Teachers course survey committee decided what should be evaluated and employed the aide of Dr. Wilson. Resolution #44 made by Senate was defeated by the Calendar Committee concerning Good Friday off next year. Universal Thesis deadline was set three days later. Ron Blandy will be the new Chairman of the Acc, Affairs Committee.

Orientation: Working on ideas for orientation for new Senators.

Committee Soordinator: Will mail out Student Newspaper. Cost will be \$7 a week.

Old Business: Resolution #43 was brought off the table concerning Student Association Secretary. It was passed.

New Business: Resolution #48 was presented by Ron Blandy concerning Memorial Day next year. The resolution was passed.

Announcements and Comments: Gary Manuse gave Departmental report for Mechanical. It was a report on a poll taken last quarter in the Mechanical concerning opinions on the establishment of an independent school newspaper. It was at least 4 to 1 in favor of retaining the present school newspaper.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 following the closing prayer.
