PHI KAPPA PHI HONOR SOCIETY MEETS MAY 20 -- Initiation of graduate and undergraduate students into the R.I.T. Chapter of Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society will be held on Wednesday, May 20 in the cafeteria of the College-Alumni Union. A reception open to Institute personnel and their guests will be held at 6 p.m. followed by a banquet and award ceremonies at 7 p.m.

Phi Kappa Phi, founded in 1897, is a national organization open to honor students from all departments of American universities and colleges. The Society serves the technological institutions in the same manner that Phi Beta Kappa serves those colleges and universities with strong major programs in the liberal arts. There are 117 chapters throughout the United States with a membership totaling more than 185,000. Persons elected into membership remain members for life.

The official installation of the R.I.T. Chapter was held at the Institute on April 22, 1970.

ROCK GOSPEL CONCERT SET FOR MAY 24 -- A concert of "Rock Gospel" music will be held on Sunday, May 24, at 2 p.m. in the Ingle Memorial Auditorium of the College-Alumni Union.
