## Kentner Named Assistant Dean

Harold M. Kentner, 68 Biltmore Dr., Irondequoit, has been promoted to assistant dean for Extended Services in the College of Continuing Education at Rochester Institute of Technology.



Kentner, who first joined the Institute in 1941 as a part-time instructor, has most recently served as director of the Extended Services Division which develops conferences, seminars, workshops, and intensive courses for industrial, commercial, civic, and professional groups. The Division also offers conferences and intensive courses on graduate and undergraduate levels for credit and credit-free instruction.

Kentner is a graduate of RIT and the University of Rochester. He became a full-time faculty member in 1950, and director of the Extended Services Division in 1958.

Kentner was recently elected to the Board of Directors of the National University Extension Association (NUEA). He is a member of the Genesee Valley Psychological Association, the American Society of Training Directors, the National Society for the Study of Education, the International Congress of Adult Education, the Psychoanalytic Foundation, American Association of Higher Education, the National Society for the Study of Education, and many other organizations.

## Rinehart to Head CCCFD

Dr. Richard L. Rinehart, former president of Bay de Noc Community College, Escanaba, Michigan, has been appointed director of the Center for Community College Faculty Development at Rochester Institute of Technology.

As director of CCCFD Dr. Rinehart will develop special programs for community college faculty; will serve as a consultant to community colleges throughout the east and will develop specialized applied science programs at the two-year college level.



The Center for Community College Faculty (CCCFD) was founded at RIT in 1968 and offers graduate programs for both prospective and currently employed two-year college faculty.

The Center currently offers an in-service program for community college teachers of engineering, technology, accounting, science, marketing, and management. In addition, RIT is the only Institution of higher education in New York State that is concentrating on training the technical faculty of community colleges.

"Dr. Rinehart's outstanding academic and technical background will be extremely valuable to RIT as we move closer in the decade ahead in support programs for two-year colleges and student transfer programs from the two-year colleges to RIT," said Dr. Roy I. Satre, Jr., dean of RIT's School of Applied Science and the CCCFD.
