Clarifications Based on Academic Senate Feedback

Questions from last meeting: How does this policy apply to RIT students who are minors attending faculty office hours?

- Definition of Program (p. 3) Added clarifying language: "General courses offered specifically to the matriculated RIT Student body are not considered 'Programs' under this policy."
- Reporting requirement separated from program procedures (p.4, p.6)

 Moved this section to follow Definitions, followed by Procedures for Programs



Duty To Report Suspected or Known Abuse or Neglect

- Duty to report about any student, whether minor or adult
- See Definitions section of policy (p. 2-4)
- Only need a reasonable suspicion
- Not necessary for employee to investigate, simply report the concern
- Campus officials determine which policy applies and whether there has been a policy violation
