Registration - Unmet Needs - If your advisees are having difficulty getting into a class they need for spring, remind them to fill out an Unmet Needs request on SIS. The departments monitor these requests. When restrictions are lifted, (there are still some NTID and evening restrictions in place) the department will first place the students on the Unmet Needs list into the open slots.
