What are the important ethical dilemmas that you and those around you face? The Elie Wiesel Foundation for Humanity invites college **juniors** and **seniors** to submit a “thought-provoking, personal essay” of 3,000 to 4,000 words analyzing “questions and concerns facing them in today’s complex society,” to be considered for the Elie Wiesel Prize in Ethics. While the topic is lofty and the potential rewards are various, the incentive is attractively pecuniary—**First Prize: \$5,000**. The deadline for submissions is December 5, 2003.
