NTID CAREER VIDEOTAPE WINS THREE AWARDS

ROCHESTER, N.Y., March 3—Achieving Goals: Phenomenal Professionals, a videotape that highlights careers of deaf and hard-of-hearing people, produced by the National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) at Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), has won three awards.

Most recently, it gained international recognition by winning The Crystal Award of Excellence from The Communicator Awards.

Achieving Goals also landed a gold Telly Award, given in recognition of outstanding non-network and cable television work worldwide, and a Certificate for Creative Excellence from the U.S. International Film and Video Festival Awards competition, which recognizes business, television, documentary and entertainment productions worldwide.

One in a series, Achieving Goals: Phenomenal Professionals is a project between NTID and the Northeast Technical Assistance Center (NETAC), a federally funded program that supports deaf and hard-of-hearing students.

"Achieving Goals is designed as a resource for high schools, colleges and other programs to make deaf and hard-of-hearing students aware of diverse career possibilities," said Patricia Billies, NETAC project coordinator.
