

NTID OFFERS EXCITING SUMMER PROGRAM FOR DEAF AND HARD-OF-HEARING HIGH SCHOOL JUNIORS

ROCHESTER, N.Y., April 2—A six-day, summer career awareness program to help deaf and hard-of-hearing high school juniors plan for life after high school will happen this summer at the National Technical Institute for the Deaf at Rochester Institute of Technology. NTID's Explore Your Future (EYF) program gives students the opportunity to experience college life, perform hands-on activities as they learn about different career choices such as engineering, business and computers, and have fun exploring their options.

EYF will offer two sessions, one from July 17-22 and the other from July 24-29. On the final day of each session, parents are invited to attend a workshop to get tips that will help them prepare their students for college.
