SPRING CAREER FAIR 2007 — Great Success! We would like to thank the 207 companies that participated at this year's event on March 28 and talked with 2,200 students and alumni. Nearly half of the participating employers conducted 685 interviews on campus the next day.

The Office of Cooperative Education & Career Services Employer Advisory Board meeting was held in conjunction with the March Career Fair. Over 20 employers participated in a packed agenda including a presentation by Mike Dwyer, Director, Research Relations on RIT's Research Focus and an interactive student panel discussion with six students from various academic programs. Following lunch with the students, employers were treated to an inside look at the Center for Integrated Manufacturing Studies and the National Center for Remanufacturing and Resource Recovery (NC3R) with a tour by Andy Harlan, CIMS Industrial Programs Manager. The lab will support a new required course, Design and Analysis of Production Systems, beginning next year.

posed to the innovative principles and philosophies of what is a model for contemporary production systems at companies across the world," says Jacqueline Mozrall, associate professor and department head of industrial and systems engineering. "I congratulate Dr. Andres Carrano for leading this effort and for his vision of creating a hands-on learning environment around these principles."

The market for students is currently quite strong. We recommend that you post early for specific jobs and majors and be as detailed as seems appropriate in describing the open position. Positions with vague job descriptions and/or listed for "all majors" won't attract many students. Try to review the resumes as you receive them and make decisions on suitability as quickly as you're able – even a slight delay runs the risk of losing your best candidate to another employer.

You are welcome to recruit at RIT any time. We find, however, that the most beneficial times for employers appear to be between April 2-May 4, 2007.

To make arrangements for on-campus interviewing, call Lynn McGahey at 585–475–5463. Lynn will assist in setting up your schedule. Interviews are usually in 30 minute blocks, but we can also customize your interview schedule to your specifications. Our facilities include a dozen employer interview rooms and our Employer Business Center – complete with internet hook up and phone access.
