NTID Announces Science Fair Winners

Winners have been announced in the 2008 National Science Fair for Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Students, hosted by the NTID.

More than 50 contestants from 14 schools in 10 states brought their exhibits to Rochester, N.Y. during the competition, held March 14 to March 16, 2008. The contestants had their expenses paid to attend the competition, with the exception of their transportation costs.

"The quality of the projects was top-notch," said Heather Emerson Jeremy, assistant director of pre-college outreach. "A lot of observers, including the judges, were quite impressed with the science projects."

The goal of the Science Fair is to promote interest in technology, science, engineering and math among 6th through 12th graders with hearing loss.

First, second and third places were awarded to middle school students, high school students and in the team division. First prize in each division was awarded \$500; second-place winners received \$300 and third-place winners received \$200. Each winner also received a plaque.

- 1st place: Victoria Rainey, 10th grade, Illinois School for the Deaf, Jacksonville, III. for "First and Second Hand Smoke."
- 2nd place: Nathan Burleson, 12th grade, Arkansas School for the Deaf, Little Rock, Ark. for "Wind Turbine."
- 3rd place: Jared Treichel, 10th grade, Minnesota North Star Academy, St. Paul, Minn. for "Testing the Magnetic Field and Plasma Interactions."

Middle School Division

- 1st place: Sara Stanislow, 6th grade, Barker Road Middle School, Pittsford, N.Y. for "Does the Insulation Really Work?"
- 2nd place: Kayla Thornton, 8th grade, Farnsworth Middle School, Guilderland, N.Y.

for "What is the Effect of Non-Organic Shampoo vs. Organic Shampoo on Hair."

 3rd place: Edwin Ortiz-Gonzalez, 7th grade, Delaware School for the Deaf, Newark, Del. for "Hot Wheels Formula Fuelers Racers."

Team Division

- 1st place: The Pennsylvania School for the Deaf, Knolis Davis (12th grade), Zobia Malik (11th grade) and Frankie Repici (10th grade) for "How Chemicals Contaminate Our Watersheds."
- 2nd place: Maryland School for the Deaf, Celine Daze and Jenna Richmond, both in 12th grade, for "Sugar in Food."
- 3rd place: Arizona School for the Deaf, Nathaniel Amann, (7th grade) and Steven Smith (8th grade) for "Fire Resistant Building Materials."
- Honorable Mention: Minnesota North Star Academy, Brienna Herold, (10th grade) and Scott Symes (11th grade) for "Perceptive vs. Reality."

This was the third year for the Science Fair. Plans are underway for the 2009 National Science Fair. Details will be posted on the <u>Science Fair Web site</u>.
