## Public Relations Writing Students see "Real World" Success

Proving that "experiential learning"—long a hallmark of an RIT education and a central theme of Provost Jeremy Haefner's May 12 "Year-End Report to the Community"—is not exclusive to "high-tech" fields such as engineering and computing, students in last fall's Public Relations Writing class, taught by Professor Michael Saffran, have, in the months that followed, experienced the successful results of their real-world final class projects.

The students created press kits—including news releases, "fact sheets" and other supporting material—promoting actual news stories of their choosing. Working with their instructor (in the role of "editor"), press kits were targeted to actual media outlets, editors and reporters. To date, nine students have landed stories in the media —affording them not only real-life experience "pitching" the media, but also clips for their portfolios (two primary goals of the project).
